### Faces of Peace: Meet Sean Mills !

Sean Mills' life had nearly come to an end—again. He had been raised in the church but ended up putting his upbringing aside to live the life that he wanted to live. What Sean didn't expect is that God would literally save him from himself, many times.

In November of 1994, at the age of 17, Sean nearly had a heart attack from smoking some bad marijuana given to him by a friend. Then, in November of 1996, Sean was drunk, blacked out, and fell asleep behind the wheel of his car. He was hospitalized for a week, and knew that it was God who had spared his life. In July of 1998, Sean was drinking again. After dropping his girlfriend off, he headed home and decided to try a stunt in his car—one that just not possible.

In the process he hit another car, full of people. Sean thought for sure that he'd killed someone, so ran up to the car he'd hit. They rolled up their windows and waved him away. Sean spent a few hours that day, in jail. He says, "And I was there in jail, I was thinking, 'Alright, Lord, I'm tired. For whatever the reason you haven't taken my life and I've been trying to throw it away. I don't want to do this anymore.' God delivered me. I went back to my church. I became serious about my Walk. A great friend and mentor of mine - whose testimony is far more astronomical than mine - he had a substance and abuse deliverance ministry. A lot of the things he talked about I knew I had done. I go to him and ask, 'Can you help me?' So he walked me through this ministry, Healing Hearts. Through Healing Hearts I put down alcohol, I put down smoking cigarettes, and a lot of the anger issues I had with people, with authority, with 'The System,' as it were. A lot of those vices have fallen - God has taken that from me."

Since this time, Sean has studied God's Word faithfully and intensely. With the encouragement of family members Sean became a student at Nyack College, D.C. Campus, to study the Bible and Christian Ministry. Sean tells us, "And there, that's where I met our pastor, Dr. Edwards. Throughout my time there, Dr. Edwards has become a mentor and a friend to me. Through our talks that we would have before class, after class, and even away from school, he would tell me about Peace Fellowship. Which brings me to why I'm here. He would explain to me the mission of this church and what this church is all about. He was asking me about where I'm at now - at my previous home - was I having opportunities to use my gifts. Through various dialog sessions that we had, I'd been praying on it, and I thought it was time for me to make a change. Not that I had a falling out with my church home, there was no breaking away from the church for doctrinal issues or anything of that nature. I had been raised in that church for 27 years and wanted to get a different look, a different feel and also resonated with the vision and the mission of this church. Which brings me here. I'm thankful to God for the people He's placed in my life from my childhood friends to my mentors and different people I've met over the years. I just believe that God has truly kept His hand on me. When it would be that I would throw my life away, He said, 'No.' And when it would be that others would take my life, He said, 'No!' To God be the Glory!"
